Premium Sale Rules:

Sale is limited to 1 animal per exhibitor and exhibitor must be an active member of 4-H and/or FFA.

The grand champion will automatically make the sale and then the formula will decide how many animals will make the sale. The reserve champion will automatically go to the sale if there are at least 5 species in that department. (Market Steer, Cross bred heifers, market swine, market goat, meat pen of rabbits, single fryer and broilers)

The exhibitor must show their animal at the sale unless they have a legitimate excuse (sickness, school function or church function). The Premium Sale committee and livestock superintendent must approve by 9:00am the day of sale.

Each exhibitor is responsible for making sure their animal is ready for the sale and in the assigned area for the sale.

The fairboard ask each premium sale participant to send their thank-you notes in a timely manner. The premium sale check will be void after 90 days.

Rules & Regulations

1. The rules, procedures and applications are applicable to all activities, events and competitions for the Ouachita County Livestock and Fair Show.
2. Fair officials and department superintendents are responsible for enforcing these regulations in their respective departments.
3. All exhibitors, parents, fairboard members and others involved are expected to deal in good faith with the fairgoing public and each other.
4. All articles or animals competing must be entered in the name of the grower, maker or owner.
5. An exhibitor must reside within Ouachita County or attend a Ouachita County School. State Law restricts exhibitors from receiving premium point money in more than one county fair.
6. Youth exhibitors are not allowed to show as a Youth at this fair beyond the fall semester following high school graduation.
7. The fair association reserves the right to reject or accept conditionally any exhibit either before or after entry is made.
8. All entries taken to the fairgrounds and buildings are submitted entirely at the risk of the owner. A night watchman will be on duty.
9. Any creative arts exhibit picked up before Sunday will forfeit their premium check.
10. Premiums will only be paid to items list in this tabloid.
11. No premium will be awarded when an exhibit is unworthy.
12. Unclaimed items will be destroyed.

13. All checks must be cashed within 90 days.

14. Exhibits shall conform to the special rules for the department. No identical item from the same individual will be accepted.
15. All questions in dispute or differences not covered by these rules will be referred to management whose decision shall be final.
16. All judges' decisions are final.
17. All judges will be from out of county.
18. No smoking in buildings.

Disclaimers, Liabilities & Restrictions

1. Every reasonable effort will be made by the Officers and Members of the OUACHITA COUNTY LIVESTOCK AND FAIR ASSOCIATION to maintain security and order on the Fairgrounds from Tuesday through Sunday. This effort will include locking of buildings and gates, the assignment of Departmental or Building superintendents, the posting of armed guards and other measures deemed necessary by the Fair management.
2. In no case shall the OUACHITA COUNTY LIVESTOCK AND FAIR ASSOCIATION, INC., the Fair, or any of its officers, directors, agents, or managers be held responsible for loss, damage, injury, death by disease, theft, or any other cause of any character to property or person while it is on the Fairgrounds.
3. Ouachita County Livestock & Fair Association members, the fair-going public, entertainers, exhibitors, concessionaires, and all other persons visiting the Fairgrounds and/or participating in events on the Fairgrounds do so at their own risk.
4. No claim for injury to any person or property will be allowed to be assessed or suit filed or maintained against the Ouachita County Livestock & Fair

Association, or any of its officers, directors, or agents, on behalf of any person, firm, corporation or their agents, representatives, servants, or employees having license to exhibit on the Fairgrounds or occupying any space thereon.

5. If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by reason of neglect, or willful act of any person, firm or corporation or their representatives, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on Fairgrounds, occupying space thereon, the Ouachita County Livestock & Fair Association and its employees shall be in no manner responsible or will they be subject to any expense or liability. All persons causing same or liable therefore shall identify said officers and organizations.
6. If property owners or others interested in the property desire protection against loss, damage, or injury from any cause, including fire, they must make their own arrangements for such protection and bear the burden of payment.
7. No persons or firm will be allowed to distribute any printed or other advertising materials on the grounds or post in any buildings without the consent of the Department Superintendent and/or the Fair Management. Exhibitors may distribute advertising matter for his/her own business or cause from a space occupied by his/her exhibit, subject to the approval of the Fair Management.
8. Persons coming onto the Fairgrounds for the purposes of disrupting and/or protesting will be escorted off the Fairgrounds by the Sheriff's guards.
9. Persons wishing to discuss the Animals will be asked to talk with **Darlene Wheelington**, the Fair's spokesman. NO DISRUPTIONS WILL BE ALLOWED INSIDE THE FAIRGROUND FENCES. (NO PROTESTING ON THE FAIRGROUNDS ALLOWED.)

How to enter exhibits

1. Bring items to the Shaddock Gym on Sunday, August 7th 2:00p.m till 4:00p.m or Monday, August 8th, 5:00p.m till 7:00p.m. The items we take in on this day is Horticulture/Field Crops, Clothing, Food Preservation, Household Arts, Recycled Handicrafts, Arts & Crafts, Home Furnishings, Fine Arts, Photography, Silk & Dried Floral Arrangements, Floriculture Potted Plants, Apairy, Needlework, Scrapbooks, Aquaculture, Tablesapes and 4H pumpkins and watermelons.
2. Stop at the registration table.
3. Receive your exhibitor number or packet of exhibitor cards.
4. Place your card on your item and the superintendent will take it to the appropriate department.
5. On Tuesday, August 9th, 7:30am till 9:00a.m bring your baked goods, fresh floral arrangements and floricultural specimens to the Events Center. (Same process as above)
6. Be sure to come back on Sunday, 2:00p.m till 4:00p.m to pick up your items.
7. All exhibits must remain in place until Sunday to receive your premium point money.
8. No premiums will be paid on items not listed in the tabloid.
9. If the item has been exhibited in the past it Can NOT be entered again.

NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethic demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of

ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair of livestock show officials.

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of

the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian or with the approval of the Livestock Director.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judged, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally

violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is giving of consent that any proceeding or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with

2. The regulations published in the various sections of this book are subject to change before the 2022 fair. The changes will be published in the newspaper or Facebook.
3. To keep infectious disease down, all animals must be washed down before bringing the animals to the fairgrounds, where the animal will be inspected and sprayed with an antifungal solution if necessary.
4. Livestock can enter the fairgrounds on **Tuesday, August 9th, 3:00p.m till 8:00p.m** and must be inspected by a representative from Arkansas Livestock and Poultry before unloading. Please have your health papers with you at the gate and give them to the department chair.
5. There will be an assigned area for grooming. No grooming in the aisles of the building.
6. There are two age groups for livestock and poultry/rabbit exhibitors.

Junior- 5 years old to fall after graduation
Open- all other ages (an open exhibitor will show for premium point money and ribbons only. The exhibitor must own their animal)
7. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner.
8. An exhibitor must reside in Ouachita County or attend a Ouachita County School.
9. Livestock enter in the Youth division cannot be entered in the Open Division.
10. The exhibitor is responsible for feeding and caring for their animals. **Do not** feed or water another exhibitors animal without consent from the owner.
11. All pens must be clean before the exhibitor will receive their premium check. Please clean pens during the week.
12. The judge will pick sale order for all departments. (swine, goat, sheep, beef)
13. No smoking in the barns or buildings of the fairgrounds.
14. **Check the schedule for release of animals.**
15. There is no special area for livestock trailers at the Ouachita Co Recreational Center.
16. Poultry must be blood tested on Tuesday before entering their cage **at the Ouachita Co Recreational Center.**
17. All livestock exhibitors must complete 5 hours of community service on the fairgrounds the week before or the Saturday before. If 5 hours is not completed the exhibitor will not be

eligible for any awards chosen by the fairboard.

18. No fans, water hose or extension cords in the aisles.
19. No water hoses inside the building. Water will be located outside the building.
20. **Dress Code for Show & Premium Sale:**
Junior and Open Exhibitors will be required to wear appropriate attire, which is neat and clean, in the show ring and during the auction. Exhibitors are to wear a collared shirt (with shirt tail tucked in), boots, and no baggy pants. No hats/head coverings or spurs will be allowed in the ring. Also, no cleavages.
21. The Ouachita County Livestock and Fair Association offers equal opportunity for participation to all persons of Ouachita County, Arkansas. No person shall be denied admission, privilege, license, right to compete or award of premium solely because of their race, religion, sex, national origin or physical infirmity.
22. No alcoholic beverages on the grounds.
23. If an exhibitor has more than one animal exhibit in a class, the exhibitor has permission to get another exhibitor to exhibit for him/her. All other exceptions must be approved by the chairman of committee, livestock superintendent and a member of executive board.
24. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid

improper conduct or questionable acts. Their values must be so certain and positive than those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example.

25. The only people in the show ring during judging will be the judge, the ribbon person and the livestock superintendent if needed.
26. If there is a special needs exhibitor that needs help during the show the parent will choose an exhibitor to help the exhibitor in the show ring with the approval of the livestock superintendent. More information will be on the registration form.

Due to the location of the county fair for 2022 the committee chair, livestock superintendent and the executive board will determine if the animal is halter broke and is trained enough to stay on the grounds of the Ouachita County Recreational Center.

Shepherd's Lead (Costume Class)

Open to all exhibitors. Must use your own show animal.

This class will be judged on originality and compatibility of costumes worn by the animal and exhibitor.
